Easy Integration of Video and Other Media into Grammar- and Function-Focused Lessons

Using authentic video and other media in class can be an effective way to increase student engagement,



add dynamic visual elements, and introduce authentic and culturally appropriate language use. It's relatively easy to find speaking activities based on videos; yet these activities often take a lot of time, and

teachers using a grammar- or function-focused textbook might have difficulty figuring out exactly how to incorporate such activities into their lessons. Some of these activities can be adapted if the right video can be found; alternatively, videos can be used to simply and effectively set the context or elicit the target language, without the use of additional activities. This talk will introduce a variety of videos that can be used to elicit, model, or practice a variety of language structures. It will touch on ways these videos can be used in grammar-

and function-focused classes, and it will highlight useful online video resources and tools.
