What Is This?

The Gwangju Communicator is a resurrection of the Gwangju-Jeonnam Chapter's earlier news publication. Our older members will remember in pre-pandemic years



of receiving a four-page, folded sheet as they entered the monthly meeting room and signed in. That was the original *Gwangju Communicator*; its contents were mainly an abstract by each of the presenters to be featured that day as well as a short biosketch. The revived *Communicator*, as currently envisioned, is to be somewhat similar yet somewhat different from what is was before. To begin with, it will be a digital publication, made available in PDF format rather than having a hard copy handed out at chapter meeting times. It is planned to be produced quarterly, appearing in the same months as *The English Connection* (i.e., March, June, September, and December) rather than when a chapter meeting is held. As a newsletter, it will continue to focus on upcoming chapter events but also include KOTESOL national events as well as other events that might be of interest to our chapter members.

Monthly Chapter Meetings

Chapter meetings for 2025 are planned to be held monthly, except in the school vacation months of January, February, July, and August. Meetings will continued to be scheduled for our regular meeting date of the second Saturday of the month (unless some important holiday supersedes). Therefore, our first chapter meeting for 2025 will be held on Saturday, March 8. The venue is still the Gwangju National University of Education (GNUE; Lindsay Herron's workplace), but the building has

changed from the pre-covid location. The meetings are now held in the Creativity Convergence Hall (창의융합관), next door to the former meeting place, in the English Cafe, on the third floor. It is located next to the large Punghyang Cultural Hall [

KOTESOL International Conference

The Korea TESOL International 2025, our 32nd annual international conference, will be held over the weekend of May 10–11 at Sookmyung Women's University in central Seoul. If you haven't been to any of our international conferences before, it is something you will want to experience. If you have been to one before, you will want to return. We are expecting a dozen plenary and featured speakers, and 280 presentations of various formats and on a variety of ELT and applied linguistics topics.

The pre-registration period for the conference is from March 15 to April 30. You may also register at the conference, but the entrance fee is less if you pre-register. The pre-registration fee is also cheaper for KOTESOL members. [Registration Fees]

Gwangju-Jeonnam Chapter is well represented among the presenters participating in the conference. Ian Moodie will be giving two



presentations, both related to professionals in education: "Escaping the Sandbox: Why Do Mid-to-Long-Term Educational Professionals Leave Korea?" and "The Unfolding of Careers: Why Expatriate English Teachers Leave the Profession." Lindsay Herron will be participating in a panel discussion on "Professionalism in the Professionalization of TESOL in Korea," and David Shaffer will be leading a 101 workshop: "Mastering APA Style Citations and References for Research Reports."

Preparations for the 2025 conference began more than a year in advance of the conference itself. Several of our chapter members are on the conference committee: Lindsay Herron, Registration director; Jocelyn Wright, Human Resources team; Phillip Schrank, Registration team; and David Shaffer, Invited Speakers director and Financial Affairs director.

Korea TESOL Journal: This semi-annual scholarly journal publishes research articles in ELT and applied linguistics pertinent to the Korean ELT context. In addition to reading these articles, consider submitting your own book report, brief research report, or full-length article for publication. [Korea TESOL Journal]

KOTESOL Proceedings: This is an annual publication of select articles based on presentations made at our international conference. It is a compilation of about 30 articles covering a wide range of ELT-related topics. [KOTESOL Proceedings]

Language Teaching: This is a long-running column in the *Gwangju News*, the monthly English language magazine published by the Gwangju International Center. Though not a KOTESOL publication per se, the column's content is provided by chapter members. Recent articles include an interview with Dr. Ian Moodie in the December issue, an interview with Dr. Maria Lisak in the February issue, and an article on grouping students according to proficiency levels by Bryan Hale in the March issue.
