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1. OVERVIEW

The Saturday Book Club (SBC) is a reading group designed primarily for the children of INU faculty and staff. The club aims to cultivate a habit of reading English-language books and enhance enjoyment through group discussions. Students will develop critical thinking and global communication skills while engaging in creative and multifaceted problem-solving activities. We are seeking highly qualified teachers for the SBC program.

2. RESPONSIBILITIES

- Conduct English reading and discussion classes for local and international elementary school students.
- Develop and implement engaging activities that promote inclusivity, diverse perspectives, and critical thinking.
- Guide students through pre-reading, during-reading, and post-reading activities.
- Encourage creative writing and word play to reinforce language skills.

3. REQUIRED HOURS

• Flexible scheduling is available. We hold monthly work schedule discussion where you can select your preferred days and number of working days per month.

4. SALARY INFORMATION

- We are looking for dedicated educators who can commit to <u>at least two consecutive</u> <u>Saturdays</u> to provide a consistent learning experience for our students.
- The pay rate is 80,000 KRW per 50-minute class.
- While the SBC program runs for four weeks, you are not required to teach all four consecutive Saturdays. We maintain a pool of teachers and hold scheduling meetings where you can select two consecutive Saturdays to teach. We ask for a minimum commitment of two consecutive Saturdays to ensure consistency in curriculum delivery and student experience.
- If you are interested in teaching more than one session, we can discuss your availability and coordinate with other teachers' schedules.
- For example, if you teach one session on a Saturday, you will earn 80,000 KRW. If you choose to teach two sessions on the same day (e.g., 10:00 10:50 and 11:00 11:50 for Grades 3 to 4), your earnings for that day would be 160,000 KRW.

5. CERTIFICATE

• Upon successful completion of 12 sessions and receiving positive teacher evaluations, you will be awarded a Certificate of Excellence in Teaching. This certificate will be issued by the Director of the Division of Global Creative Education and Research for Gifted and Talented Students at the Institute for Corpus Research, Incheon National University. This recognition acknowledges your dedication and excellence in teaching within our program.

- Reading English books.
- Post-reading activities: drawing, role-playing, and sentence completion exercises
- English discussions focusing on characters' actions and feelings.
- Creative writing: modifying book endings or adding new scenes.
- Word play: solving puzzles using key vocabulary from the books.

• Elementary Upper Grades (Grades 5 and 6)

- Reading English books.
- Post-reading activities: discussions, presentations, project work.
- English discussions exploring book themes such as justice, friendship, and adventure.
- Creative writing: crafting new stories or character journals.
- Analytical activities: enhancing logical thinking and writing skills.
- Cultural understanding activities: researching and presenting cultural elements from the books.

* The curriculum outlined above serves as a basic suggestion. You are welcome to propose creative additions or modifications to the curriculum as you see fit. However, please note that any proposed changes must be approved by the program committee.

8. QUALIFICATIONS

- Highly qualified teachers, preferably with a master's degree in a TESOL-related field.
- Experience in teaching English to young learners.
- Ability to engage students in interactive and creative learning activities.
- Strong communication and organizational skills.

9. APPLICATION PROCESS

• Interested candidates should submit their resume and a cover letter outlining their teaching experience and approach to engaging young learners in a book club setting.
